Lithuania is situated in Eastern Europe and is southernmost Baltic State

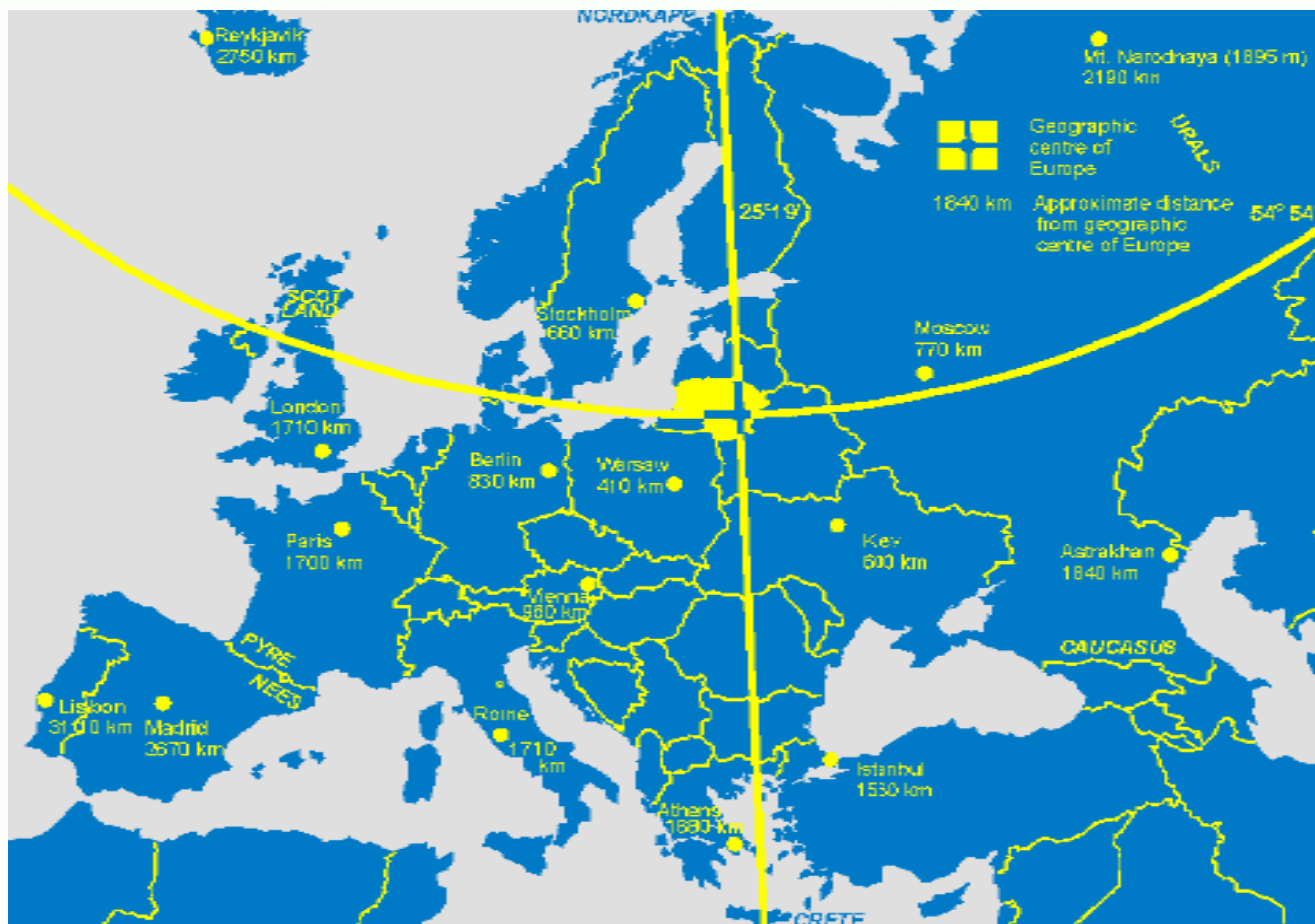

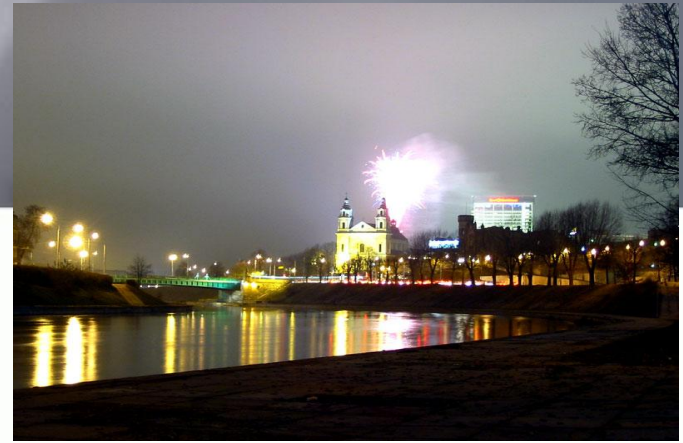

VECC

- Stages:
 - 2004 officially Lithuanian government declared a wish that Vilnius become an European Capital of Culture 2009;
 - 2005 application form was specified;
 - 2005 EC decided to give a status of Capital of Culture 2009 to Vilnius;
 - 2006 VEKS agency creation;
 - 2007 programmes, projects and etc.;
 - 2008-2009 projects, culture events realization.

- Gym and sport hall

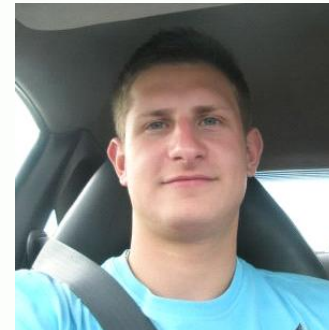


International activities:

Implementing this goal we:

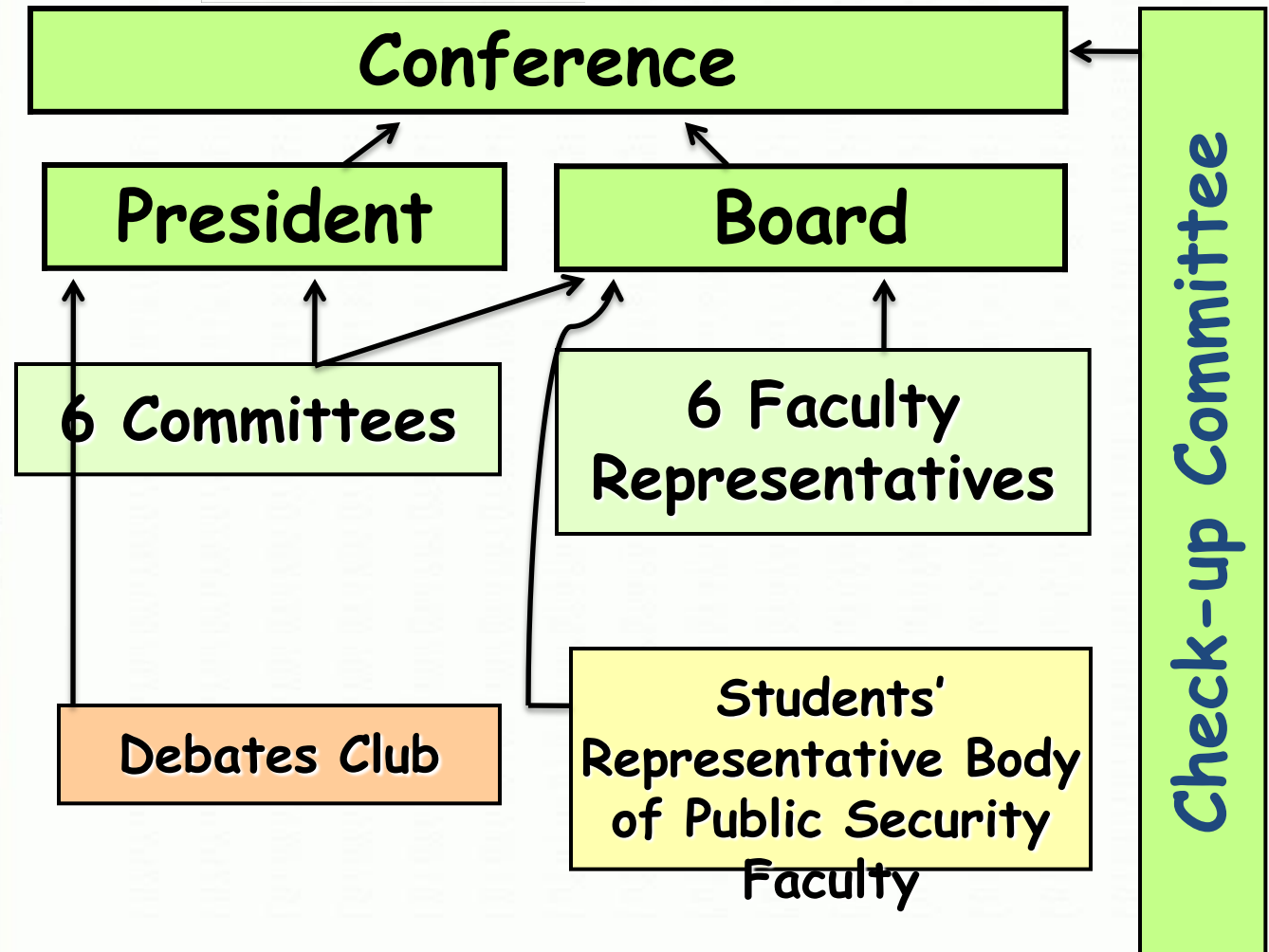
- participate in the process of studies improvement in the university;
